The Jesus Seminary of the Himalayas continues to grow and develop its programming as it trains pastors and church leaders. The Jesus Seminary now has three programs: PhD, Masters of Ministry and a Basic Program to train rural pastors with a limited education.

Centered in Kathmandu. Nepal. it was the first Seminary in Nepal to offer a PhD

The philosophy of the Jesus Seminary of the Himalayas was not to create a seminary that was heavy in land and building expenses. This is critical in placvacant land now is selling for \$55,000.

"I don't know of any other seminary in the world that can operate on a budget. One hundred donors could make it hapas low as ours," noted Rev. Dr. Jan L. pen. Beaderstadt, president of the Jesus Seminary. "Our Board of Regents has worked to keep our expenses as low as possible in order to provide a quality education at an affordable price for our students."

Students do pay a small fee for their education. A PhD costs \$500 while a Masters of Ministry Degree is \$300. These fees are split between paying Nepali instructors and expenses for the focuses on Biblical instructions, teaching Seminary.
