## Health Updates

By the time you get our latest newsletter, I'll be on my way to University of Michigan hospital for my next surgery. On Tuesday, October 6, I will be having surgery on my back.

I have degenerative arthritis of the spine. MRIs have shown that lumbar 4—5 —6 are compressing the sciatic nerves. This is creating severe pain in both hips and down the legs, making it very difficult to walk.

The sciatic problem has been getting worse over the last four years. The doctors have said that if I don't get the surgery, I won't be able to walk in two years. With that advice, I'm following doctor's orders and having the surgery.

I've chosen UofM hospital because its probably the best hospital in Michigan. I've had good care there in the past for my ankle. The surgery to install the artificial ankle went well, and today I'm able to walk at times without a cane So that's a big improvement. The ankle pain is gone.

My doctor, Dr. Patel is a mountain climber and in 2019 climbed Mt. Everest in Nepal. When he learned I do work in Nepal, he was very excited. He told me that if I have this surgery on my back, I will be able to trek to Everest Base Camp in eastern Nepal. It's a place I've wanted to visit for some time. So I've accepted his challenge!

The plan is to remove one vertebrae and space it out with rods in my back. If all goes according to plan, it will not be all that invasive. I should be out of the hospital in about three days. I can ride and be able to drive within a couple of weeks. It will take around three months for it to properly heal. I will be unable to lift more than five pounds during that healing process.

I will keep you updated on my progress. I'm anxious to get back to Nepal and Uganda. It's been too long that I've been away. The good news is that my people there are doing a good job and things are progressing well

## Jesus Seminary now accredited

The Jesus Seminary of the Himalayas has now been accredited by the accreditation board of the Worldwide Anglican Church (WAC). This accreditation took place September 28.

"This is a great opportunity for our students and faculty as we are now being recognized internationally," said Rev. Jan L. Beaderstadt, president of the seminary.

The Jesus Seminary now joins with other seminaries in India, Uganda, Mozambique and Ghana. These seminaries will be working more closely together as they share information and course material.

The Jesus Seminary currently offers Masters and PhDs in ministry. They are now adding a basic level course of study for rural pastors.

Efforts are underway to link the Jesus Seminary with other schools of higher learning including several in the United States. The accreditation through the Worldwide Anglican Church is a first step in making the Jesus Seminary a world-respected institution of higher learning.

### Murray to start training program

Rev. Mike Murray, vice-president of Renaissance Outreach Ministries, will be starting his chaplaincy training program in mid-October. Pastor Mike had planned to start earlier, but a fall in August caused him to have to delay the start. He is planning to serve as a police chaplain in retirement from full time pastoral ministry.

Renaissance Outreach has joined with Trekking Mart of Kathmandu, Nepal in helping the Christians to develop tourism potential. The local people can learn the hospitality trade, which includes developing home stays and guest houses, becoming guides, drivers, opening local restaurants and more.

"Tourism is the easiest way to become self employed for these people," noted Rev. Beaderstadt. "They can easily set up some kind of business for little to no investment and start earning an income."

Rev. Beaderstadt and Mr. Gopal Babu Shrestha of Trekking Mart are working to develop international trade. Trekking Mart has over 15,000 customers. He has been serving Nepal, India and Bhutan. He has recently added Uganda and is working to expand into other parts of East Africa.

Courses on business and tourism will soon be added to the Jesus Seminary of the Himalayas.

## Looking for teachers

Barb Beaderstadt, the wife of Rev. Jan L. Beaderstadt is looking to retire as a Head Start teacher in June of 2021. What she is not planning to do in retirement is to just sit around. She's already accepted a plan to help train early childhood teachers in Uganda.

Barb will be working with the St. Agnes Teacher Training School in Kampala, Uganda where she will be helping to train teachers in proper approaches to early childhood education.

Barb is also looking for early childhood teachers to come and work with her. They can either teach by coming to Uganda or by ZOOM. Those who do choose to come to Uganda will have opportunities to go on a safari at Queen Elizabeth National Park near Kasese and/or trek in the Rwenzori Mountains.
