Forest Fires devastating Nepal

Some days in Kathmandu the air is so thick with smoke that you can't even see, reports our people in Nepal. Forest fires in the mountain regions have blanketed the country with smoke.

Even satellite images from space are showing the fires along the high peaks. The fires are also in the lower regions as well, creating plenty of lung problems.

Springtime is the dry season in South Asia. Monsoon rains last from mid-June to mid-September. The rest of the year is relatively dry. Rains are very occasional, creating very dry conditions.

The fires started several weeks ago. While some sources blame climate change, others point to the traditional way of farming. Farmers will burn the leftover crops and weeds. This creates better soil, but does come at a cost.

The fires appear to have spread when the farmers lose control and they spread into nearby forests.

Unlike the US, Nepal does not have good fire fighting equipment. A major fire in Kathmandu destroyed a landmark store as fire trucks were hampered by the narrow streets that only allowed for smaller trucks to enter. It was very hampered when the fire hydrants were dry, due to water shortages in the Kathmandu Valley.

Schools have been ordered closed and the government has told everyone to stay indoors. Gopal Shrestha, managing director of Trekking Mart reports that people are sick and lethargic because of the massive smoke that has settled into the Kathmandu Valley. Going to his home village in Gorkha District offers no relief because the hills around the village have fires.

Pray for early rains as that is the only way these fires will be put out. The people of Nepal have suffered enough.
